

THE PRESIDENT OF THE RESIDUAL SPECIAL COURT FOR SIERRA LEONE ("Residual Special Court")

**RECALLING** Motion for Termination of Enforcement of Sentence in the United Kingdom and for Transfer to Rwanda, filed by Counsel for Mr. Charles Ghankay Taylor, on 13 June 2014 ("Motion");

**NOTING** Prosecutor's Submissions in Response to Charles Taylor's Motion for Termination of Enforcement of Sentence in the United Kingdom and for Transfer to Rwanda with Public and Confidential Annexes, dated 15 July 2014 ("Response");

**NOTING** Reply to Prosecution Response to Motion for Termination of Enforcement of Sentence in the United Kingdom and for Transfer to Rwanda, filed on 15 July 2014 ("Reply");

**CONSIDERING** Article 23(3) of the Statute of the Residual Special Court for Sierra Leone ("Statute") which provides *inter alia* that the Residual Special Court shall have power to supervise the enforcement of sentences, including the implementation of sentence enforcement agreements;

**CONSIDERING** Article 13(1) of the Statute which authorizes the President to convene a Trial Chamber consisting of two judges appointed by the Secretary-General and one judge appointed by the Government of Sierra Leone in the event that the need arises;

**COGNISANT** of the need to ensure expeditious proceedings before the Residual Special Court;

**HEREBY** convenes a Trial Chamber composed of

Justice Richard Brunt Lussick Justice Teresa Anne Doherty Justice Emmanuel Eku Roberts

to hear and determine all matters arising from the Motion.

**ORDERS** that the Trial Chamber shall exercise its functions remotely unless the President otherwise decides for good reason.
